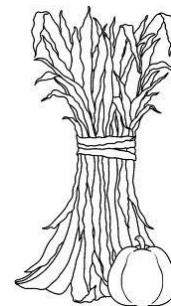

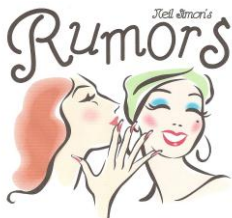

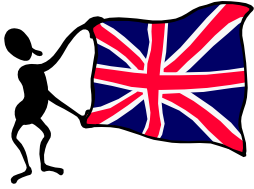


The GSA is planning a Halloween party on October 30th

Guidance News



College Planning Timeline 2013-2014

~ JUNIOR YEAR ~

November-December-2013

1. Students will receive PSAT scores and should review their answers to determine areas that may need improvement. The College Board provides all students who take the PSAT with a very informative breakdown of the answers by category. All students may request their original test booklet along with this score report.
2. Talk with recent high school graduates who come home from college.
3. Begin to involve your parents in the college selection process.
4. If you have a documented disability and receive special education services or 504 accommodations, please discuss testing options with your counselor (and Special Educator). Eligibility for extended time and other accommodations **must** be pre-approved by the College Board and/or ACT.

January-February-2014

1. Continue taking your academics seriously and do your best heading into second semester.
2. Plan senior year courses carefully. Do they meet graduation requirements? Do they meet college requirements? Continue to challenge yourself when selecting courses.
3. **January 25, 2014** SAT Exam. Some students may consider taking a test preparation class.
4. **February 8, 2014** ACT Exam.

March - 2014

1. **March 8, 2014** SAT Exam.
2. Joe O'Neil and the Guidance Department will have a meeting with parents and students to make sure they are on the timeline.

April - 2014

1. **April 12, 2014** ACT Exam. **FHS Test site.**
2. Schedule a student/parent conference with Mr. O'Neil.
3. Research colleges of interest by exploring on Naviance, reading college handbooks, and surfing the net. (<http://connection.naviance.com/foxborough>)
4. Visit college campuses. Many are open on Saturdays for tours.

May - 2014

1. **May 3, 2014** SAT Exam/SAT Subject Tests. **FHS Test site.**
2. The junior class will attend the NACAC National College Fair together at The Boston Convention & Exhibition Center (BCEC).
3. Participate in AP Exams, if applicable.
4. If interested in R.O.T.C. or a military academy, look into special procedures and deadlines now. If you want a four-year ROTC scholarship, you should begin the application the summer before your senior year.

June - 2014

1. **June 7, 2014** SAT Exam/SAT Subject Tests.
2. **June 14, 2014** ACT Exam.
3. Ask for 1-2 recommendations from teachers who know you well. Student and parent "Brag Sheets" are available in the guidance office and on the FHS website: (<http://foxborough.k12.ma.us/fhs/departments/guidance>)
4. Make sure you are on the mailing list of the schools that interest you.
5. Stay involved. Find a full-time or part-time job, participate in a camp or summer college program or do some volunteer work.



Summer - 2014

1. Visit colleges and take campus tours. Keep notes on your visits! At colleges you are serious about, make appointments to have an interview with an admissions counselor.
2. Download applications from colleges to which you will apply. Check application deadlines. Many colleges and universities may have early dates or rolling admissions.
3. Type your resume. You can use the template on Naviance. (<http://connection.naviance.com/foxborough>)
4. If you are an athlete planning to continue playing a sport in college, register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. (www.ncaaclearinghouse.net)

SAT AND ACT TEST DATES AND REGISTRATION DEADLINES

Register to take your ACTs and SATs. We recommend taking the both the ACTs and SATs at least once, but preferably twice.

Attention Seniors **Submitting College Applications**

The college application season is in full gear and the hustle and bustle of submitting transcripts on time brings up questions about the process. We would like to provide you with information that will help you navigate the process.

1. Fill out your "Brag Sheet" thoroughly.
2. Ask a teacher or 2 (depending on the college) **and** your guidance counselor to write a recommendation for you. Give him/her a copy of your "Brag Sheet" and send a request through Naviance.
3. Fill out the transcript request form and hand it to the guidance secretary with your \$2. Do this at least 2 weeks prior to deadline.
4. Send your SAT and/or ACT scores from www.collegeboard.org and/or www.actstudent.org. It may take up to 3 weeks for your college to receive the scores.
5. Complete college applications and submit them electronically.

Colleges and universities have a specific process they follow after they download application documents. Often times, documents that we send through Naviance eDocs are not immediately processed by the admissions office at the college or university. Many colleges receiving a high volume of applications need several weeks for the information to be updated in their system.

When we send a document via Naviance eDocs we receive a confirmation of electronic delivery. This confirmation is notifying us that the documents have been received at the institution. However, it **does not** mean that the documents have been entered into the college/university's admissions database.

Do not panic if you receive an e-mail indicating something is missing. Colleges are often a couple weeks behind in entering the information in their database.

French Exchange 2014

We are preparing to return to Longjumeau, France for an exchange with le Lycée Jacques Prévert in February.

Students will experience what it is truly like to be part of a French family. While honing their linguistic skills they will immerse themselves in the history and culture of the area with visits to Paris including the Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, le Musée d'Orsay, Montmartre, Notre Dame Cathedral and a ride on the Seine in a bateau mouche.

We will also visit Normandy (Arromanches, Sainte Mère l'Église and the cemetery at Colleville), Chartres, Versailles and the châteaux in the Loire valley. Students will try new foods and meet new friends. Students will participate in other activities on the weekend that will be arranged by the individual families. We still have 2 spaces available. The cost is approximately \$2000. This may increase by a small amount due to possible fuel surcharges.

We will leave after school on Tuesday, February 11th and we will return on Friday, February 21st.

AP French and Spanish

On October 22nd the Advanced Placement French and Spanish classes will participate in a pilot program offered by the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. A representative from the Education Outreach Department of the museum will visit Foxborough High School and will provide a lesson on European art.
