From the Principal Jeffrey S. Theodoss

Dear Parents / Guardians:

Foxborough High School has been working to create school wide academic expectations. The school wide academic expectations provide explicit foundational commitments from the high school to our students. Also, in compliance with the expectations of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (the organization that accredits school systems), the school wide academic expectations allow the faculty to have conversations that will assess curriculum strengths and weaknesses and provide requests for changes or modifications to the curriculum. The commitment from the school is to universally equip our students with the necessary skills to compete at the highest levels.

Although not used as a graduation requirement, the reporting out of our academic expectations will allow students and parents to better understand student progress toward achieving these expectations.

The FHS Academic Expectations are as follows: all students will read actively and critically, write using Standard English for a variety of purposes and audiences (long essays and open response writing), use language skills to communicate ideas and information coherently, effectively use technology, and develop critical thinking skills for assessing information and solving problems.

Each department will be responsible for reporting out on two areas of the school wide academic expectations. A department with a primary responsibility will be expected to provide multiple opportunities, through formal and informal assessments such as but not limited to: research assignments, PowerPoint presentations, reading assignments, or daily assessments that align with the academic expectations.

For instance, if your child has an English class, chances are he/she will receive a score from 1 to 4 on the academic expectations associated with reading actively and critically, and with writing using Standard English for a variety of purposes and audiences. The parent simply needs to look at the associated rubric to understand what a numerical score

from 1 to 4 represents. It is also expected that all courses will support the school wide academic expectations with assessments when it is feasible to do so.

As part of our pilot process, the school will regularly report student progress on achieving the academic expectations once this year (at the end of the school year). Parents and students will receive a report on each student's individual achievement. Next year, the academic expectations will be reported at a minimum of three times per year. Please review the attached rubrics at the end of this newsletter associated with each academic expectation.

Directed Study

Directed study is a part of most students' schedule. All students are required to take 6.5 credits per school year. The remaining three periods per each seven day cycle will be directed study classes. Students may utilize the library, study for upcoming exams, finish homework, work on group projects, receive extra help from a teacher or meet with their guidance counselor. These are some of the available opportunities for each student. Although students do not receive a grade, it is expected that students come prepared during this time. As I have mentioned on numerous occasions, our goal is to create a relaxed, yet focused environment for all students. As we begin the second semester, our teachers have been reminded as to the administration's expectations for students during directed studies. Please remind your child to use this time wisely and productively.

School Emergencies

During a School Council meeting and also at the principal's coffee hour, discussions revolved around school emergencies and the use of Connect Ed. As part of the school's safety plan, students are placed in certain situations to learn how to effectively deal with different emergencies. Fire drills, bus evacuations, lock downs and "stay in place" procedures are conducted yearly. Scenarios

are changed to have students practice procedures with different situations. Therefore, there is often a police / fire presence at the high school. If a parent is concerned with police / fire being present on school campus, the following protocol will be in place. If you are not contacted by the school or superintendent's office, one may conclude that a drill is in progress.

For years schools have conducted fire drills and bus evacuations without notifying parents. Due to changing world events, more security and protocols are in place to provide as much school security as possible. Unfortunately, sometimes practicing a lockdown or drug sweep of the building may produce more anxiety than the much practiced fire drill. In the event of a real emergency, parents will be immediately provided with pertinent information and timely updates. Also, we have worked diligently to have every student provide the school with updated parental information. Therfore, any changes in cell phone or home phone numbers should be reported to the main office as soon as possible 508-543-1616 or 1617.

Curriculum Night

Curriculum Night will take place on Wednesday, February 11, 2009. There will be two sessions, with the incoming eighth grade students and their parents meeting from 6:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. and then all returning high school students and their parents will meet from 7:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Each session will provide parents and students with an overview of the curriculum, followed by small group meetings with the appropriate guidance counselor.

Enrichment Program

Beginning on Monday, February 9th and running through Friday, May 1st, utilizing a 632 Grant provided by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, FHS will offer extra help for students. The program will provide tutorial services from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Friday. The ten week program is designed to use a student's directed study periods and after school time to support as many students as possible.

The nineteen hours of mathematics and English tutoring per week will allow identified students to receive help as needed, until the scheduled MCAS testing. Again we encourage students to utilize the

available help. Also, any student wishing to receive extra assistance may utilize this service. Simply check with your guidance counselor.

FHS STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN BIOTECH EXPERIMENTS AS PART OF MASSBIOED'S BIOTECH PROGRAM



FHS student David Santos is shown in this picture using a micropipette to introduce a gene into bacteria.


As briefly mentioned in the previous edition of the *Foxworthy*, Foxborough High School was selected last spring to be one of 49 Massachusetts public high schools to become new members of the BioTeach program. Sponsored by the Massachusetts Biotechnology Education Foundation, BioTeach seeks to introduce the teaching of biotechnology to the curricula of every public high school in the commonwealth. To date, 162 schools are members of the BioTeach program.

BioTeach provides funding for the purchase of biotechnology equipment, teacher training during the summer at local colleges, and onsite support from Boston University's CityLab. On December 10-12, the MobileLab bus was scheduled to visit FHS to kick off the BioTeach program. Unfortunately, due to mechanical problems, the MobileLab was not available. The program went off as scheduled; however, using the equipment FHS was able to purchase using BioTeach grants, along with the help of Britta Bookagen, a Boston University CityLab educator.

In August, FHS science teachers Mr. Paul Charpentier, Ms. Elizabeth Keohane, Mr. Darrin James, and Ms. Suzan Lins spent three days at Framingham State College receiving biotechnology training. Teachers performed three biotechnology experiments that could be brought back to high school classrooms. The teachers felt strongly that training was a vital component of this program. Performing these experiments beforehand, with colleagues from many other high schools, was invaluable.

Students from the Biology I classes of Ms. Keohane, Ms. Lins, and Mr. James performed an experiment entitled "Mystery of the Crooked Cell", which involved performing gel electrophoresis in order to diagnose sickle cell anemia in an imaginary individual by analyzing hemoglobin protein. Mr. Jeremy Champlin's AP Biology students, with Mr. Charpentier's assistance, performed an experiment whereby a gene was inserted into the DNA of a bacterium using a plasmid, and then observed how the newly inserted gene changed the color of the bacterial colonies produced. This technology demonstrated how the manufacturing power of bacteria may be harnessed to produce such substances as insulin, for example. A third experiment may be added to the curriculum in the future, using electrophoresis to analyze DNA fragments in a forensics simulation.

Both students and teachers alike were energized by this exciting new program. Biotechnology represents one of the fastest growing sectors of the state's economy. Governor Patrick has often spoken of making Massachusetts an epicenter for growth in this industry. BioTeach has provided FHS with the funding to purchase materials that would be otherwise difficult to obtain, given the current economy, along with teacher training and long-term support. Biotechnology is here to stay at Foxborough High School.




DEBATE TEAM NEWS

Patriot huddles with FHS

New England Patriots defensive end Jarvis Green will have a post-season, even as his team sits out the Super Bowl.

He will continue his fight for something bigger, though far less sparkling, than the Vince Lombardi Trophy.

On Monday night, Green joined members of the Foxboro High School National Honor Society for a pre-game huddle about the work mission they are about to embark on in Louisiana to help families still battered by the catastrophe called Katrina.

Green will be guiding 10 NHS members during a Feb. 15-20 trip to his hometown of Donaldsonville, LA, a town ravaged by flooding from Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and still rebuilding today.

Seated with NHS community service coordinators Seana Peterson and Blair Read, Green gave the School Committee some first person testimony on the needs of the Gulf Coast region and his own town, on the banks of the Mississippi River. Peterson said the NHS's goal is to "establish a lasting cycle of community service" in the area.

School board members praised the work Green is doing for people in need through his Jarvis Green Foundation (www.jarvisgreen.com.) and commended the NHS's ongoing fundraising efforts and the planned work mission.

"High fives to the National Honor Society and to (principal)
Jeff Theodoss, who's been pushing service," board member
Kate Kominsky said.

School superintendent Chris Martes, who has visited some of the hardest-hit sections of Louisiana, said the recovery will go on for many years. He said the work trip and the NHS fund drive, which was aided by local businesswoman Mrs. Patti Martin, who was also present, will put a Foxborough stamp on some of the homes people will, in time, return to.

Board member Larry Harrington, whose church group volunteers on the Gulf Coast, said the Foxboro students' reward will be the memories they will form.

"You are a tribute to the New England Patriots and to your community and family," Harrington told Green, who will be seeing to the students' lodging, meals and safety.

The initiative by Green and the NHS drew a Channel 4 camera crew and sportscaster to Monday's school board meeting.



Foxboro Jazz Ensemble Plays it Cool amid the Heat of History

Eric Kenseth, a drummer in the Foxboro High School Jazz Ensemble who is preparing for a career as professional musician, reached one peak musical moment.

As the Foxboro senior sees it, the performance by 23 Foxboro school musicians at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. Monday, on the eve of the presidential inauguration, just sparkled. It sparkled because the young musicians were taught to ignore the glitter, and treat the event like any other home or away musical experience.

"During the sound check, Mr. Massey said 'Just listen, you don't have to overblow,'" Kenseth said, referring to Foxboro music director Stephen C. Massey. "He'd say that if we were playing at our high school -- just listen." This was no auditorium gig in the land of blue and gold, however. The FHS Jazz Ensemble had been invited to celebrate Barack Obama's inauguration and Martin Luther King Jr. Day by renowed trumpeter and composer Wynton Marsalis.

Marsalis is artistic director at Jazz at Lincoln Center, which co-sponsored the "Celebration of America" concert in Washington, D.C. About 1,000 people made up the invitation-only audience, as the Foxboro ensemble performed a Duke Ellington piece, "Perdido."

During the performance, FHS senior Schuyler Milender found herself trading turns at the piano with composer Dave Brubeck, at 88 a legend in the music world. Joining the ensemble on stage were young professional saxophonists Francesco Cafiso and Grace Kelly.

The Foxboro group started the trip on Sunday, Jan. 18th and returned Tuesday, Jan. 20th, but only after spending a couple of hours near the Washington Monument, breathing in the atmosphere of a million eyewitnesses to history.

"I think it was really important for us to be there on Inauguration Day, seeing these crowds of people of all different backgrounds and ethnicity, especially after playing that concert," Milender said. "Our experience that day kind of mirrored what had Wynton's message been the night before. He was trying to show that jazz musicians of different ages and backgrounds can come together and play jazz, just like at the inaugural all these people can come together and celebrate a new time for the country."

Unable to see much beside the crowds and nervous about getting split up, the Foxboro group got back on their bus and made their way to a Chili's restaurant, where they watched the inaugural on television before heading home.

Chaperoning the trip were Mr. Massey, his wife Barbara Massey, music teacher George Murphy and another adult.

Paquito D'Rivera, a noted jazz clarinetist who was born in Cuba, stopped by and took a solo during the jam session. Retired U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, a member of the Rockefeller Foundation, the other co-sponsor, came in and just listened.

With no seats available in the audience, the Foxboro ensemble, after playing, watched the rest of the show on a screen in another room in the Kennedy Center. When the group returned to the Westin Hotel in Alexandria, VA after the concert, Massey offered a word of praise. "I think you're going to remember that performance," Kenseth recalled the teacher saying. "I think we swung pretty hard."

Foxboro's band earned the invitation as the most frequent finalist, over the past 15 years, in the center's Essentially Ellington Competition and Festival in New York. The ensemble is set to record a series of Ellington pieces to be anonymously submitted for the next Essentially Ellington competition.

Other members of the Foxboro ensemble who took the historic trip were: Seniors Maria Navedo, Codi McNeff, Griffin Vacheron, Julia DiCanzio, Corey Field, Seana Peterson, Marissa Lattanzio and Joe Walsh; juniors Sophie Kass, Rachel Fuller, Chris Kelm, Matt Muirhead, Christian Lyman, Allana Connell, Jeremy Thayer, Rob Mortenson and Ian Ayers; sophomores Brendan Thomas and Tyler Appel; freshmen Cooper Vacheron and Connor Schultze.
