- 1. At that web address, you will be asked for your email address and your name.
- 2. PTCFast will then send parents a confirmation email.
- 3. Click on the link in the email to see a screen showing all available teachers for your parent-teacher conference.

4. Click on each teacher you wish to see and choose an unfilled time slot. The system will send you a confirmation email with the date and time you have reserved.

That email will include a link that allows you to change your appointment time later, if you so desire. The system will also send you a reminder a few days before your conference.

Diana Myers-Pachla, Principal, Joseph A. Heinricher, Beth A. Sylvia, Vice Principals and guidance counselors will be available for parent conferences. If you desire a conference with your child's counselor or an administrator, drop in at the appropriate office during the conference hours.





#### JOHN AND ABIGAIL ADAMS SCHOLARSHIP

Foxborough High School is proud to announce that sixty of our seniors have qualified for the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship based on their performance on the spring 2014 grade 10 MCAS tests. These students scored in the advanced category in either Mathematics or the English Language Arts section of the grade 10 tests and scored in the Proficient or Advanced category on the second subject (Mathematics or English Language Arts). These students combined MCAS score on these assessments have ranked them in the top 25% at Foxborough Public School. The purpose of the Adams Scholarship are to reward and inspire student achievement, help attract more high-performing

students to Massachusetts public higher education, and provide families of college-bound students with financial assistance.

The Adams Scholarship provides a tuition waiver for four years of undergraduate education at the University of Massachusetts, the seven state colleges, or fifteen community colleges. Students who receive this Scholarship must complete their college studies in four years or less and maintain a 3.0 grade point average. The waiver does not cover fees, books, or other expenses.
