

From the Principal Jeffrey S. Theodoss

Dear Parent / Guardians,

Learning needs to be valued as an ongoing process that requires the daily interaction of students with their teachers and peers. Tardiness and absence from class affects this learning process.

Recently there has been a large increase of student tardiness which in turn causes disruption to the first period classes already in session. Please take a moment and review with your student the importance of arriving to 1st period classes at 7:33 a.m. each day. The following is from page seven (7) of the FHS student / parent handbook for you and your student to review.

TARDINESS TO SCHOOL

Tardiness disturbs classes and hinders the ability of other students to learn. All tardiness will result in office detention unless the student who arrives late is either accompanied by a parent or brings in a note when he/she is admitted to school. A student must bring the note explaining the tardiness to the front office. All tardy notes should include that day's date, explanation for the tardiness, parent signature and a phone number where the parent can be contacted to verify the reason for the tardiness. Only 5 (five) explained tardies will be accepted per semester. Each tardy over the 6th, per semester, will result in office detention regardless of a note.


The auditions for these awards took place on Sunday, March 7th at the Florence Hayward Sweet Club House in Attleboro. The auditions for this year were for vocal musicians.

The students met each morning at Ies Ramon Muntaner School in Xirivella (Valencia). Trips to the Fallas workhouses and Museum Ciudad del Artista Fallero, Gulliver's Park, Museum of Modern Art and Viveros Park, Oceanografic / Hemisferic were highlights of the trip. Students traveled by coach bus to Barcelona where they stayed in a hostel overnight. Sights in Barcelona included, La Rambla, Barri Gotic, La Sagrada Familia, Montjuic, Tibidabo and so much more.

French Exchange

Fourteen students and two teachers from Foxborough High School traveled to France during February vacation as part of the ongoing French Exchange with Lycée Jacques Prévert in Longjumeau, France. We were cordially received by the principal, town administrators, teachers and students of the lycée and spent a wonderful (albeit cold!) week visiting our friends in Longjumeau and sightseeing.

Our visit to the Cathedral in Chartres was enhanced by the expertise of a longtime guide, Malcolm Miller, who has devoted his life to the study of this gothic marvel. We toured the Châteaux of Amboise and Chenonceau in the Loire Valley and marveled at the beauty of these incredible palaces of French kings. The trip to Normandy where we visited the town of Arromanches – site of the Allies' landing during the Second World War- and the American Cemetery were inspiring moments for the students. Our trips to Paris to visit the Louvre, Montmartre, Sacré Coeur, Notre Dame Cathedral, and the Eiffel Tower were all memorable and exciting. Students spent a day at the lycée and had the opportunity to make some interesting comparisons between a French lycée and an American high school

The most important part of the trip however, was the connection students made with their French hosts. During the week that students spent living with French families, they not only improved their communication skills and fluency in the language, but they experienced a different culture and formed many friendships which will undoubtedly last for many years to come.

Prom Contract Signing Night

On **Tuesday, April 13, 2010 at 7:00 p.m.** in the high school auditorium there will be a Prom Contract Program. The program will last approximately 45 minutes. An attorney from a Boston law office of Campbell and Campbell will discuss the importance of "Social Host Liability". Immediately following, Principal, Jeffrey Theodoss will give the audience an explanation of the terms of the contract, and then an opportunity for parents and students to sign contracts.



All students who plan to attend the prom must have on file at the high school a prom contract which they and their parents have signed, and a parental consent form. Prom guests who are not students at FHS must also have contracts signed by their parents unless they are 18 years of age. These students may sign their own contracts.

The purpose of the contract is to help ensure that the prom will be a substance free event. Contracts must be signed in the presence of a school administrator. No contracts will be sent home for signing, and no student may purchase a prom ticket until a contract has been signed.

What should juniors be doing now?

Start making a list of your abilities, social/cultural preferences, and personal qualities. List things you may want to study and do in college. Look at the Naviance website

(http://connection.naviance.com/foxborough), to complete the career interest inventory, "Do What You Are," as well as college exploration.

Learn about colleges. Look at their websites. Make a list of college attributes and features that interest you.

Make a file to manage your college search, testing, and application

With your family, start to learn about financial aid. Read the Department of Education's Funding Your Education. Use Getting Financial Aid published by the College Board and the financial aid calculator at www.collegeboard.com to estimate how much aid you might receive. Begin a search for financial aid sources. National sources include the College Board Scholarship Handbook and electronic sources. Do not overlook local and state aid sources. MEFA is a great resource free of charge for Massachusetts's students. The phone number is:

In the Spring Juniors should:

Visit some local colleges - large, small, public, and private. Get a feel for what works for you. February and April vacation are great for visits. Attend local college fairs.

Develop a list of 15-20 colleges that attract you. Request view books and information about financial aid and academic programs that interest you.



Take the ACTs and SATs.
