From the Principal Jeffrey S. Theodoss

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Hello and welcome back. I hope everyone found time to get away and relax a little bit before beginning another school year. The first phase of school renovations has been completed. The majority of the asbestos abatement is complete. The old second floor classrooms and hallway tiles have been replaced, and the foreign language lab has been re-carpeted and refit with new technology. Also, the cafeteria floor has been replaced and the old tennis courts have been demolished and reconstruction is nearly complete.

During this school year, probably beginning in December when all the bids have been awarded, other areas of the school such as new HVAC units, replacement of fire alarms and the replacement of all windows will begin. During the following summer, all the science labs will be gutted and re-equipped with up-to-date furniture and technology, and the first floor will be retiled. The final phase will include the replacement of the roof and gymnasium floor. The maintenance staff has done an outstanding job preparing the building for the school year.

Teachers will return for three days of professional development beginning Tuesday, September 1<sup>st</sup> and students will arrive on Tuesday, September 8<sup>th</sup>. All students should report to homerooms, while freshmen should report to the auditorium. School will begin as usual at 7:33 a.m.

Your child will receive their student handbook and their schedule during homeroom. Please review each document. I would recommend reviewing the attendance, cell phone, dress code, and alcohol and drug policies. Also, you should review and sign-off on the parent/guardian permission form and return the form, along with emergency data form during the first week of school. These forms were sent to all parents / guardians last week.

Shortly, we will announce an evening seminar for parents to explain how parents may access their child's grades using our PowerSchool Program. This brief seminar will help to clarify the process and answer any questions. During the seminar, each parent will receive a password that will allow the parent access to their child's information. We believe this tool will assist parents in their attempt to work with their child and also help parents to stay abreast of their child's progress. Early in the fall we hope to host this program.

During the first semester we will run a mock 14-day schedule using additional time (approximately 70 or 80 minutes) for one period every day. Currently each period runs for 57 minutes and we have a seven-day rotating schedule. Each day we drop one period and rotate the periods. The intent is to allow each subject a more flexible block of instruction time once every seven days. We have been discussing this issue for over a year and began visiting other school systems this spring to assess the feasibility of such a plan. We will continue to report out on our progress.

Finally, in hopes of minimizing student drinking, we will have breathalyzers available at all school functions. Any student who appears to be under the influence will be asked to submit to a breathalyzer test. I must say for the part students have conducted themselves most appropriately at school functions. From time to time students take risks and put themselves in precarious situations that compromise their health and safety. As principal, the most distasteful part of the job is suspending or expelling students from school for drug or alcohol offenses, or eliminating students from athletic programs due to alcohol or drug violations. We are hoping to be proactive, so that students will think twice about using drugs or alcohol before coming to any school sponsored event.

#### Parents for School Council Needed

The school council meets monthly on the first floor of the media center. The school council is a representative, school building based committee composed of the principal, parents, teachers, community members and students. School council members assist the principal with developing educational goals that are consistent with school committee goals and statewide student performance standards. The council helps to identify the educational needs of the students attending the school. They also review the annual school budget, help formulate a school improvement plan, and review the student handbook. The council allows parents to get a first hand understanding of the workings of the high school.



#### November 2009

- Send SAT and subject test scores to meet deadlines.
- Initiate FHS transcript request, guidance counselor information / letter of recommendation form, SPED form, envelopes for mailing...at least three weeks before deadline.
- Minimum three (3) week notice for counselor letter needed
- FAFSA: Obtain pin #, one for student and one for parent. Go to www.pin.ed.gov.
- Note FHS mailing deadlines for December. (Winter Break)

#### December 2009

- Take December SAT subject tests if needed.
- Evening meeting at FHS on FAFSA.
- Complete FHS transcript request forms, counselor recommendation forms and other FHS forms as needed. (Minimum three-week notice)

#### Pay attention to all deadlines!

#### January 2010

- Take SAT and subject tests if needed.
   FAFSA File form online as soon as possible at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

   (Minimum three-week notice)

#### February 2010

- Apply well before a deadline...early is **VERY** good.
- Continue to collect information on colleges to which you apply. APRIL is "decision month" and this can be a stressful time/short time to make your final decision.

#### March 2010

- Begin to compare college acceptances/financial aid packages for April decisions.
- Wait for March/April decisions.
- Continue **achieving good** grades for final report card.

#### April 2010

- Review financial aid awards with parents. Ask for advice! (College Counselor - Mr. O'Neil)
- Revisit colleges as necessary during spring break.
- Final decision/deposit required by 5/01/07. (*Try to make deposit earlier for better housing choice*.)
- Continue achieving good grades for final report card.

#### May 2010

- AP preparation and exams if enrolled.
- Thank you note to all teachers, friends, etc. that have written letters of recommendation and helped in your application process.
- Final Exams...Continue achieving good grades for final report card.

#### June 2010

- Final transcript needs to be sent to your college for "proof of graduation."
- \$3.00 paid to guidance office for the mailing of your final transcript.

- Talk with your parents to understand the ground rules regarding how much financially they are willing to spend, how far away from home is acceptable, your comfort level and other family commitments and concerns.
- Write to colleges (email) on your list for information you cannot get from their websites.
- Use the Internet for college searches, information on colleges and programs.
- Attend area college fairs and regional college nights.
- Visit some colleges; try at least on college during April break.
   Students are still there.
- Plan summer visits to colleges.
- Keep in touch with your College Counselor and discuss any concerns and guestions you may have.



- Register for May / June SAT I & the June SAT II as needed.
- Re-evaluate what is important to you and your family in a college.
- Read all information you are receiving.
- Refine your lists of colleges...delete some, add some different ones.
- List important dates, requirements, deadlines on each school on the "blue form"...SAT I and SAT II requirements, letters of recommendations...so you have all information in one place.
- If you know what essay questions you might be addressing, begin drafts of essays ...have people help you.



- Maintain academic grades/ colleges are "turned off" by low grades.
- Schedule SAT I and SAT II tests as needed.
- Beware of deadlines...consider Early Action and Early Decision.
- See your College Counselor early in the school year.
- Understand FHS's procedures for requesting a school transcript, senior data form, and letter of recommendation..etc....
