# From the Principal Jeffrey S. Theodoss

On behalf of the administration, faculty and staff, welcome back to school. Students it's time to shake out the cobwebs, check your class schedule, reset your alarm clock and get ready to go. We have been under construction all summer. The contractors have worked diligently to get the building ready for the 2010-2011 school years. As you know, we have been involved in a twenty million dollar renovation project. The science rooms, science prep rooms, bathrooms, roof, boilers, windows, ventilation units, plumbing, heating, removal of asbestos and new flooring have been targeted for replacement or repair. We will still have to finish some of the above mentioned projects, but we are ready to open on September 7th.



Kudos goes out to our maintenance director, Mr. Mike O'Leary and the custodial staff for an unbelievable job. I went on vacation at the end of June, and arrived back at school only to see a trench running the length of the hallway and six feet of dirt on each side. Floors were removed and ceiling pulled apart. I thought to myself, there is no way this project will be anywhere near complete before school starts. Again Mike O'Leary did a wonderful job making sure all the work was coordinated to maximize everyone's time on the job. Mike did not sleep much this summer and his driving skills eroded as he sped from school to school. We will have to make a few modifications during the school year, but there will be no major impacts to student learning, so we are ready to go.

During the first day of school, students will receive information sheets that will ask them to verify addresses and phone numbers. As always, it is important that not only the high school, but also the central office have the correct information so the superintendent's office can contact you in case of student or school emergencies.

Also, at some point early during the school year, students will have the ability to use personal laptop computers in school. Initially, we will have wireless access in the library and we will expand over time.

When we surveyed students about their interest in using laptops during the school day, over 97% of the student body positively responded. Students can use their laptops in the library for research purposes, virtual high school classes or general school needs. Students using laptops in the classroom may use them mostly for note taking opportunities.



However, it should be noted that with any technology enhancement comes the potential for theft. Students must take the necessary precautions to prevent theft from occurring. That being said, every year iPods, graphing calculators and cell phones become prey to theft. Most times the thefts occur because the student did not take the necessary precautions. Please note; do not give your locker combination to anyone. Do not take short cuts. If you have a music or physical education class, where you leave items exposed in the hallway or on the changing benches, give your valuables to the teacher or lock them in your locker prior to class.

The flip side, any student caught stealing a laptop will be expelled from school. Due to the price of the laptop, the theft would be considered a felony and pending due process, the student would forfeit their right to attend FHS.

We will inform students when wireless access becomes available. This will take place when construction issues are completed. We recommend that parents discuss this concern with their children (we will also discuss our concerns during the opening day meetings with each class).

Shortly, Power School user names and passwords will be issued to parents and students. Each user name and password may be used by students and parents to access their accounts. Teachers will update grades every two weeks, and as regularly as possible, teachers will list assignments in their grade book for parents and students to view. The intent is for parents to understand the level of performance for each assignment, not to calculate grade

averages. Based on weights assigned to tests, quizzes, projects, etc, a final quarter grade will be tabulated by the teacher. Power School should be used to facilitate conversations with your children about their positive achievements or their problematic areas that will allow parents to better support student efforts. We certainly welcome inquiries; however the first line of questioning about a grade should be between the student and the teacher. This program was very well received by parents during the last school year. We hope to continue to make improvements to the process.

#### College Planning Calendar

#### September 2010

- Register for the fall SAT/ACT tests.
- Meet with the College Advisor to discuss college and financial aid.
- Search colleges, manage and revise list.
- Prepare for the SAT: <u>www.collegeboard.com/</u> SAT prep.
- Request teacher recommendation(s).
- Register for November SAT/ACT, subject tests as needed.

#### October 2010

- Meet with Mr. O'Neil.
- Parent/student college information meeting at FHS.
- Become familiar with FHS transcript request forms.
- Take October SAT and subject tests.
- Provide teacher(s) with information and envelopes for recommendation(s).
- Note Early Action/Early Decision application deadlines.
- Begin all applications.
- Write applications essay(s) and personal statement(s).
- Begin CSS / Financial Aid profile for certain colleges, if required.
- Register for December SAT, subject tests.
- Meet Early Action/Decision deadlines.
- Transcript and recommendation requests <u>MUST</u> be made at least three (3) weeks before deadline.

#### November 2010

- Take November SAT/ACT, subject tests if needed.
- Send SAT and subject test scores to meet deadlines.
- Initiate FHS transcript request, guidance counselor information / letter of recommendation form, SPED form, envelopes for mailing...at least three weeks before deadline.
- Minimum three (3) week notice for counselor letter needed.
- FAFSA: Obtain pin #, one for student and one for parent. Go to www.pin.ed.gov.
- Note FHS mailing deadlines for December. (Winter Break)

#### December 2010

- Take December SAT subject tests if needed.
- Evening meeting at FHS on FAFSA.
- Complete FHS transcript request forms, counselor recommendation forms and other FHS forms as needed. (Minimum three-week notice)

#### January 2011

- Take SAT and subject tests if needed.
   FAFSA File form online as soon as possible at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- File all forms at FHS for transcripts to be sent.
   (Minimum three-week notice)
- Pay attention to all deadlines!

#### February 2011

- Apply well before a deadline...early is **VERY** good.
- Continue to collect information on colleges to which you apply. APRIL is "decision month" and this can be a stressful time/short time to make your final decision.

#### March 2011

- Begin to compare college acceptances/financial aid packages for April decisions.
- Wait for March/April decisions.
- Continue **achieving good** grades for final report card.

#### April 2011

- Review financial aid awards with parents. Ask for advice! (College Counselor - Mr. O'Neil)
- Revisit colleges as necessary during spring break.
- Final decision/deposit required by 5/01/07. (*Try to make deposit earlier for better housing choice*.)
- **Continue achieving good** grades for final report card.

#### May 2011

- AP preparation and exams if enrolled.
- Thank you note to all teachers, friends, etc. that have written letters of recommendation and helped in your application process.
- Final Exams...Continue achieving good grades for final report card.

#### June 2011

- Final transcript needs to be sent to your college for "proof of graduation."
- \$3.00 paid to guidance office for the mailing of your final transcript.
