#### PARENTS AND THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

Coach not Quarterback. That, in a nutshell should be the role of parents in the college search and selection process. As parents get caught up in the hype about how hard it is to get into colleges, many become more and more anxious about the process, and more involved than they should be. Ideally, searching for the college that best fits a particular student should be a growth experience for the students. For the first time, students are asked to really think about their preferences, their goals, and how they learn best. Students who devote time to truly learning about themselves are the ones who find the best college matches.

The college application process is the beginning of a student's independent academic life. As part of the process, students develop research and organizational skills, learn to meet deadlines, and analyze data. They need to read critically and compare and contrast offerings at different colleges in light of their own needs and wishes. By allowing students to take a primary role in the process, parents encourage growth and individual thinking, and help their children learn to make independent decisions.



Ideally, parents act as supporters and cheerleaders in this process. They should provide their children with the tools they need to get information or skills: the help of a

counselor, access to the internet, college guidebooks, test preparation aids. Together, parents and children, with the help of a trusted advisors, should develop a college list that includes appropriate colleges that meet the student's profile and desires (and hopefully, the parents' too.) Families should plan a trip to visit as many of these schools as is feasible. Parents need to be upfront with students about their own goals for their children, and any limitations they need to impose such as location or cost.

To be fully invested in the process, students would be responsible for completing their own applications. While parents can play a



role by proofreading, lifting a pencil to the paper is stepping over the line. Some students want their parents' input on essay, but often the college consultant or an English teacher can provide a more objective view.

Just as parents needed to step back and allow their toddler children to learn to walk on their own, here too, they must play a supporting role. By acting as coach, rather than quarterback in the college selection process, you help your child to move on in his/her journey to independent adulthood.

Lexi has done it again. After taking the AP Spanish Language and Culture course in her junior year at Foxborough High School, Lexi's AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam was so superior in May 2016 that the College Board sent her a letter to inform her that it falls into a very select category.

Advanced Placement Exams are scored on a scale of 1 to 5, where a 5 is equivalent to a grade of "A" in the corresponding college course. Lexi not only received the top score of 5 but was one of only 108 students in the world (amounting to just .07% of all 2016 AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam takers) to earn every point possible on this difficult assessment. Lexi's Spanish teachers in the Foxborough Public Schools recognized her talents in the language early in her education, leading her to take the most challenging courses available.

Her performance on this exam demonstrates a sophisticated expression of the language with advanced proficiency. For a nonnative speaker of the language to achieve this level of proficiency, this is an especially illustrious achievement.

We applaud her hard work, diligence, and enthusiasm and wish Lexi many future successes.

#### History of Veterans Day

In late July of 1914 the nations of the world found themselves thrust into a conflict that would leave a terrible impact on human history called the Great War. Later known as the First World War, nations on all continents mobilized vast militaries to war with one another. In an age of rapid technological advancement, military strategy found itself hard pressed to keep pace with an arms race that claimed numerous lives, forcing nations to call upon even more individuals to fight. Countries normally removed from events within the eastern hemisphere, such as the United States, were drawn into a devastating struggle that many believed to be the end of all wars. During the entirety of the war over sixty five million individuals were mobilized to fight in world war one, of which more than half became casualties. The United States called upon nearly four and a half million individuals to serve their country after its entry into the war in 1917, where they fought alongside allied powers on the land, in the sea, and in air.

Thankfully, after four long years of conflict, the warring powers declared the cessation of combat operations on the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918. That date, November 11<sup>th</sup>, was thereafter referred to as Armistice Day. The world attempted to pick up the pieces of its own war shattered reflection. The massive forces assembled to fight in the war were either decimated in the conflict, or afterwards drawn down to a shadow of their former sizes. The veterans that fought in that bloodshed returned home to their former lives, although a great number of them found it difficult.

A year later, on the one year anniversary of Armistice Day in November of 1919, President Woodrow Wilson honored the efforts of all allied individuals who had served during the war, orating on their heroism and the importance of remembering their service. His speech that year started the process of creating a special day to honor veterans for their service in contrast to Memorial Day which honors those who died in the line of duty. In 1938 Armistice Day became a legal holiday, and in 1954 the day was renamed Veterans Day. In that same year, in order to cement the importance of the day, former President Dwight D. Eisenhower gave a speech asking the American people to "solemnly remember the sacrifices of all those who fought so valiantly, on the seas, in the air, and on foreign shores, to preserve our heritage of freedom" and to "reconsecrate ourselves to the task of promoting an enduring peace so that their efforts shall not have been in vain." <sup>2</sup>

The scope of Veterans Day grew over time from the end of the First World War to today, honoring the service of all veterans in peace and wartime in service to the United States. Today communities in the United States observe Veterans Day with reverence, never forgetting those who so bravely defend our liberties and freedom.
