Mathematics Department News

...... Ms. Susan Carle, Department Head



One of the most common questions we hear from parents is "What can I do to help my child at home?" Often what is most helpful isn't about specific content but rather about a habit of mind. In class, we have a set of mathematical practices that we stress with students. Probably the most important one is to make sense of problems and <u>persevere</u> in solving them.

Too often students will give up on a problem that requires them to think about a solution. In this fast paced world, they are often looking for a quick solution and when it isn't there we hear the dreaded "I don't get it." What this usually means is that the student needs to stop and think about how to approach the problem. Advances in science, technology, and information processing and communication, combined with the changing work place, underscore the need for all students to learn mathematics at deeper conceptual levels, beyond rote formulas, procedures, and rules. This means learning better problem solving skills. Business and industry demand workers who can solve real-world problems, explain their thinking to others, identify and analyze trends in data, and use modern technology.

The following list of questions, from the National Teachers Council of Teachers of Mathematics, can be used to help prompt your student when he/she is having difficulties. These questions won't tell him/her how to solve the problem but instead focus on what can be done to better understand the problem and what tools can be used to help find its solution.

- What is the problem that you're working on?
- Are there instructions or directions? What do they say?
- Are there words in the directions or the problem that you do not understand?
- · Where do you think you should begin?
- Is there anything that you already know that can help you work through the problem?
- What have you done so far?
- Can you find help in your textbook or notes?
- Do you have other problems like this one? Can we look at one of those together?
- Can you draw a picture or make a diagram to show how you solved a problem like this one?
- What is your teacher asking you to do? Can you explain it to me?
- Can you tell me where you are stuck?
- Is there someone you can call to get help? Can you discuss the problem with a classmate?
- Would using a calculator help you solve the problem?
- Would it help to go on to another problem and come back to this one later?
- Is there a homework hotline at your school? What is the phone number for it?
- Why don't we look for some help on the Internet?
- If you do only part of a problem, will the teacher give you some credit?

With any luck, these questions will help start a dialogue about problem solving and perseverance. We are looking forward to another great year!
